This work weekend event provides an opportunity for you to share with others how outdoor ministry has affected your spiritual life. **The facility of Craig Springs cannot grow and prosper if its supporters do not grow and prosper.** Please share your love of Christ with others by participating in this event.

Because food and lodging requires careful planning, **it is essential that Work Weekend participants register in advance...**even if you are coming up for only one day. It is important that we know how many people to expect for Work Weekend so we do not have an embarrassing shortage or a wasteful surplus of food. **It is easier to cancel a reservation than it is to process a late registration.**

All Youth (18 years and under) must have adult supervision. Adult leaders should be prepared to work with their youth as a group or as part of a larger group. Adult leaders must agree to lodge with their youth as well.

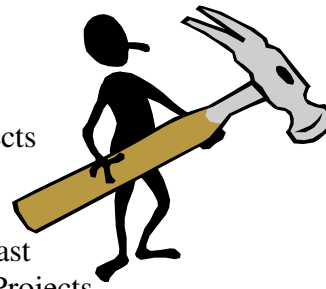

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT

Work Weekend

REGISTRATION AND LODGING

Registration and lodging will be handled at Central Hotel (7). When you arrive at camp, report to the office. Specific lodging requests can be made on the enclosed registration form. Lodging requests will be on a first come-first served basis. We will do our best to fulfill requests. *Youth leaders are required to lodge in the same building as their youth in order to maintain appropriate supervision.*

WORK CREWS AND JOB LISTS

A list of jobs categorized into different areas or interest/skills (plumbing, lawn, garage, etc.) will be posted. If you do not sign up for a work crew on this registration form, you will be assigned to a work crew as you register. Work with your crew on the assigned tasks and cross the tasks off the list when completed. If you or your crew complete all the jobs on the list, find a crew that needs assistance and help them. Youth leaders are required to work with their youth. Each work crew will have a “trail boss” whose name will be highlighted on the work crew task lists.

TOOLS, EQUIPMENT AND PROPERTY

It is *very important* to put tools, equipment, furniture and property back where you found them. Keep track of your own tools and equipment too. It’s easy for tools to disappear at Work Weekend. Most camp-owned tools and equipment can be found either in the garage (4) or the office (7). Cleaning supplies can be found in the downstairs laundry room in Oak Lodge(3). Paint supplies can be found in the “dungeon” at the loading dock near the kitchen (5). Scrap wood and plumbing materials can be found in the garage (4).

CAUTIONS

Practice safety and situational awareness as you work. Be aware of what is going on around you, and be careful. If you aren’t sure about something *ask*. There is a C.B. Radio located in the office (7). If you have any questions or need help locating something, go to the office and call for staff by radio.

CLOTHING AND WEATHER

Weather is tricky in Craig County. It can be warm enough for t-shirts and jeans or even shorts during the day, but it can also be quite cold at night. Be sure to bring appropriate clothing and bedding for uncertain weather. It is also important to bring clothes and shoes that are appropriate for work.
