<u>Dream Seed Grant Report from First Christian Church, Hampton</u>

In September of 2024 First Christian Church, Hampton hosted its first annual family camp. A camp designed specifically for people with disabilities and their families. The camp closed that year with a talent show which planted a seed for a new ministry. That being a choir made up completely of people with disabilities. In December of that year, the choir, known as the Exceptional Disciple Praise Team, was launched. The choir humbly began with 5 vocalists and has now grown to 20. These vocalists come with a variety of disabilities from blindness to developmental delays. Two of our vocalists are unable to speak without stuttering, one did not speak until the age of 5, and many have speech deficiencies. But each member brings their gift of voice to sing praises unto God.

The Exceptional Disciple Praise Team, from this pastor's perspective is a living example of who we are as a denomination. Diverse in many ways, but one in God. The Praise Team is an ecumenical endeavor. Our choir director, an Ordained Deacon in his own church, Cornelius Hodges, comes from a different denomination as do 90% of our vocalists. Yet, each week we all gather at First Christian, Hampton, for choir practice, a fellowship meal, fun, and service. Through this ministry our vocalists have grown in confidence and self-esteem. Although they are a very tight knit group, their inclusiveness is awe inspiring.

This year we were graciously awarded the Dream Seed Grant from the region. This grant allowed us to take our choir members to Craig Springs for a 5-day camp. Although we only took 10 vocalists, the choir was able to lead worship at two locations in Blacksburg. Warm Hearth Village a senior living facility for those suffering with memory issues and Blacksburg Christian Church (DOC). The choir enjoyed making crafts with the residents at Warm Hearth and having pizza party with the congregation at Blacksburg Christian. The gift of song reached beyond the normal barriers of society; as race, age, and economic status melted away, as friendships were made and smiles were shared.

Our camp theme this year was "God In Us" with an intentional focus being hopeful, helpful, and humble. Throughout the camp we used Worship and Wonder stories to draw us into our focus of the day. On Thursday, as Reverend Elaine Austin began our time in the glass house with the story of the good Samaritan, God began to move. Through tears, stories were shared which turned into long conversations between unlikely pairs. Invisible walls fell and healing began to happen. These conversations continued off and on throughout the day as God continued to move. Through silent tears and wailing cries each of us found our own healing that night. We closed the evening with communion amid the glow of the campfire. Forever touched and anxious to return to the mountain next year.

At the core of the training/experience is the belief that boundary violations occur as a direct relationship to our life being out of balance. As human beings, we constantly adjust to keep our life going and "balanced." The ways in which we make these adjustments can either be healthy or not so healthy. This boundary training seeks to provide tools and skills to help everyone make solid healthy choices to keep our lives in healthy balance. It is hoped that this proactive approach will reduce the need or frequency of unhealthy boundary behaviors. We accomplish this through a mixture of presentations and interactive activities. This experience is more spiritual retreat than simply a training lecture. We hope that this new approach will enrich the God-Created wholeness of who people are while improving the overall safety and health of clergy and laity throughout the church.

Amy Spangler-Dunning, LPC (Licensed Professional Counselor) & M.Div (Ordained Minister) brings together the mental health and ministry worlds to provide awareness and tools for maintaining our balance and boundaries in this world. Craig Springs Kitchen Renovation project begins to receive gifts:

Our Goal is 1.2 million and we already have currently in the Kitchen Renovation Fund Approximately 350,000. Over the last months I have learned of individuals, churches, past campers & counselors who have given \$10, \$50, \$1000, \$5000, \$8000 and more to support this project. I have received word that congregations of all sizes are having bake sales while others are putting a set amount in their next year's budget. We give thanks for this gift and all the gifts that have and will come in to help make this long awaited kitchen renovation happen.

How the Dream Came to be?

(A Tale of Two Stories that form the underlying purpose and focus for the Virginia Regional Dream/Seed Grant Funds)

The Elsie Tease Principle:

Elsie Tease was a member of Battery Park Christian Church in Richmond. She asked for permission and the blessing of her minister and congregational board to take up "above and beyond" offerings from her church to create a fund that would be used to help people move into and/or live at The Summit. A few months later a check was received for \$124.86. It began with an idea and a few small gifts of change (coins mostly) that inspired something beyond the size of those nickels and dimes. This gift became the Seed money for the Care Fund to come alongside people moving into the Summit. **The Elsie Tease**Principle is that sometimes a small gift of funds can help a small idea/ministry grow into something larger.

The Carrie Burwell Principle:

Carrie Burwell was a member at Rocky Mount Christian Church in Rocky Mount. She went to her minister with the nearly unbelievable idea that "We need to build a Home for the Aging in Virginia." Her minister replied to her with words often spoken when ideas are seemingly too large to fully comprehend how they could ever come true, "Well, we will need money for that to happen." So, Carrie Burwell left her house to the Region in her will. This gift became the seed money for The Summit. The Carrie Burwell Principle is that sometimes ideas for new ways of ministry are so huge and unimaginable that they need a significant starter gift to allow others to believe it is possible.

The Three Grant Funds and what they are intended to support:

Each year the interest from the designated endowment will be received and utilized with the following purpose:

- CARE FUND: 40% will be designated for the Care Fund. The Care fund is intended to provide solidarity grants to individuals wishing to move into The Summit. These grants and selection of recipients shall be the ministry and responsibility of the Retirement Center Board.
- 2. Congregational Dream/Seed Fund: 40% will be designated for seed money to the Region for offering grants to congregations and other organizations of the Region with a priority given for ministries to or with Seniors, but other ministries may also be given consideration. *
- 3. Region & Beyond Dream/Seed Fund: 20% will be designated for other Regional or General Ministries of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). *
 - Grant Funds 2 & 3 shall be the ministry and responsibility of the Administrative Council of the Region

Criteria for Awarding Funds 2 & 3

- The grant requestor must hold membership in an organization that has membership in the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ).
- The requested ministry must have the approval and support of the leadership of that congregation or ministry.
- The ministry must meet the "Spirit" of being a New or innovated ministry. These funds are not meant to support ongoing budgets.
- 4. It meets either the "Elsie Tease or Carrie Burwell Principle"
- Priority will be given to grant requests that address issues related to seniors and/or involve more than one Disciples congregation or ministry.

How to apply for a Dream/Seed Grant:

- Simply follow this link or use the QR Code to fill out the short but important grant request form.
- Develop a strong narrative to help the Administrative Committee understand your ministry idea.
- Get feedback and support from your congregational leaders
- Be available to join the Ad-Council meeting to answer guestions.
- Plan to share your work/idea/story with the wider church.
