Thank you for your continued support and prayers for Rev. Merinda Easley and her husband. From Rev. Easley "Update - He is going home today. No problem with heart or anything else. Dr. told him to check his blood pressure before he takes his medicine. If below 110, do not take it.....the final conclusion is that he may have been dehydrated."

In addition, I request your continued prayers for our brothers and sisters in Ukraine and do not allow compassion fatigue to forget about them.

I also ask for prayers and support for my colleague Rev. Andy Mangum, Regional Minister in the Southwest. In the recent weeks, he has been dealing with the impact of several mass shootings in Texas as well as the recent incident in which a man used his car to run over individuals who were gathered outside a migrant shelter seeking asylum in the United States. Some of our own Disciples pastor's were called in to provide immediate pastoral support for the families. I am really asking for prayers for all of my regional colleagues as the pain and suffering of those for whom they care for takes a toll on them.

A Brother's Peace by Jan Linn

Families can be messy because relationships often are. The Strange family of Castle Cove, NC is no different. Three brothers grow up with the same parents who love them equally and provide for them generously because they can, yet each brother turns out different. Harrison, the oldest, takes over the family sawmill business. Sonny, the middle one, goes down the rabbit hole of alcoholism, while Sydney, the youngest, becomes an Episcopal priest who is determined to save his brother from himself, driving a wedge between them that finally forces him to confront his own humanity, including his unconscious white privilege endemic to small town southern life he has always taken for granted. Caught in the tension between the demands of truth and the resilience of hope, *A Brother's Peace* will make you laugh and cry as you experience the power of storytelling at its best.

This novel is an excellent book for church reading groups and book clubs and has a Reader's Guide included in the back. It is available online, including Kindle and other Ebooks, and at all local book sellers. Jan Linn is a Disciples minister and a native of Lynchburg. He has had 19 non-fiction books published. *A Brother's Peace*, published by Sunstone Press, is his debut novel.

Summary of Work Weekend Tasks

Much needs to be done each spring to prepare the camp for the summer season, but as they say many hands make for light work. What follows is a summary list. For the most part they require labor, along with tools and supplies that the camp keeps on-hand. However, if you choose to bring some of your own tools and supplies it will be greatly appreciated and it will stretch what we have on hand. There is something for everyone, so come one come all.

Cleaning: All rooms in all buildings need to be cleaned & inspected for needed repairs.

Screening: There are screens on doors and windows that need to be patched or replaced.

Leaf Removal: In the fall and winter leaves blow in next to the buildings and into the ditches. To protect the buildings from rot and allow them to dry, these leaves need to be removed and spread into the woods.

Landscaping: If you have a green thumb, bring your own equipment or use what we have and work on the various flower beds, bushes, ivy and creeper.

Game Room: Everything needs to be removed, the room and equipment cleaned, and everything returned in an ORGANIZED way.

Ball Court: The court needs leaves removed, then scraped and pressure washed. A new ball box needs to be built on the side next to the road. Also repairs need to be made on the gate(s) & fencing. Donations of good serviceable balls would be appreciated..

Equipment: Trimmers and Mowers - Service, & Repair as needed and possible.

Firewood: Firewood needs to be cut, split, and stacked, please bring your own equipment.

Trail Work: Build and mark new trail-head from ball field connecting along the brook to the white blazed trail to the Potts Mountain overlooks, AND trail maintenance on the Potts Mountain Trail

Building Repairs: A variety of minor repairs need to be made by those with the skills.

Oak Lodge

This major renovation project has a variety of components remaining. Many require the skills of electricians, plumbers, carpenters, and various other building skills. For specific details and become part of this major renovation project contact admin@craigsprings.org.

Clubhouse

This project includes both inside and outside work and needs funding. The Campfire area needs picnic tables repaired or replaced. Benches around the campfire could be added The Clubhouse itself needs to be thoroughly cleaned, some minor repairs to be made.


Antioch Christian Church, Martinsville

Antioch Christian Church held an open house to celebrate replacement for their burned church after a tragic fire in 2017. The fire completely destroyed the building of one of the oldest Black Disciples of Christ churches. Antioch was established in 1876, and the building that was destroyed had been built in 1976. The only items that were salvaged were one cross that is now displayed on the podium and some Bibles. The new church building, standing in almost the same spot as the old building, was used for the first time on the first Sunday in February, and the church members were excited to be back. LTS ALUMNA RODENBERG ELECTED PRESIDENT OF HELM



The Board of Directors of Higher Education and Leadership Ministries (HELM) of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) is excited to share with the larger church that Rev. Dr. Tamara Nichols Rodenberg has been elected President of HELM.

Rev. Dr. Rodenberg served as the 20th President of Bethany College in Bethany, W.Va., from 2016-2022. From 2011-2016, she served as Vice President for Advancement at Brite Divinity School in Fort Worth, Texas. Prior to

Brite, Dr. Rodenberg served as a two-year intentional interim President at the Disciples Seminary Foundation in Claremont, Calif., from 2009-2011.

In addition to her academic administrative work, Dr. Rodenberg is an ethicist, earning her PhD from the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, Calif. She earned her Master of Divinity degree from Lexington Theological Seminary and was ordained by the Christian Church in Kentucky in 1992. Her call to be the President of HELM is historic, as she is the first woman to serve in this capacity.

Dr. Rodenberg comes to HELM as an accomplished administrator, collaboration builder, and gifted leader of our church. The HELM Board of Directors congratulates Dr. Rodenberg and welcomes her to the HELM family. They also honor her husband, Rev. John Rodenberg, and their two adult children, Heather and Matthew. Dr. Rodenberg will begin her ministry with HELM on May 1, 2023

Western Kentucky Tornado Rebuild

Looking for a way to make a difference and get members in your congregation excited about how church can really make a difference in the world? The Christian Church in Virginia (Disciples of Christ) is adding a mission trip to the 2023 camp schedule. Participants will do tornado relief work in Western Kentucky from July 4 - 8. The group will stay at First Christian Church, Princeton, KY. CrossRoads Missions will provide most of our meals. The lodging and meals are provided by generous donors. This is open to middle school students (rising 6th graders or at least 11 years old), high school students and adults of any age. The participants need to have the ability to go up and down stairs to the bunk rooms and work outside during hot and humid days. Those over 16 years of age will build homes with Habitat for Humanity in Dawson Springs, KY and those 11 years of age to 15 years of age and their chaperones will do other tornado recovery work and community development work. The cost is \$100.00 if you ride in the van, \$50.00 if you provide your own transportation. Additional costs will be lunch on the way and on the way back and ice cream and other snacks. The amount available each year is determined by the amount in the fund. The amount of the award is based on financial need, and the number of applications (up to \$2,500).

GUIDELINES

- 1. The applicant must live in Virginia.
- 2. The applicant must be a member of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) for a least one year prior to making application.
- 3. The applicant must currently attend an ATS accredited seminary and be under the care of the Commission on Ministry in Virginia at the time of the application.
- 4. The applicant must show financial need.
- 5. A completed application form and transcript, if available, must be mailed to Virginia Disciples Women Scholarship Fund, 1290 Enterprise Drive, Lynchburg, VA 24502. A picture for publicity will be required if a scholarship is awarded.
