The question and answer discussion that followed left all in attendance with an awareness of the importance of this issue. Each person attending was given a kit to carry that included Narcan.


Virginia Camping Ministry 2024 Camp Dates.....

At BCC, our kids and adult sponsors, including the church's Director of Children, Youth and Family Ministries, Susan Epperly, work the garden in the spring and summer as part of the children's worship experience. They learn appropriate lessons then head to the garden. What they harvest is shared with the church family, the families who participate in our Headstart Preschool....then the rest is sold in Bedford's Farmers Market. Several hundreds of pounds of food are distributed and/or sold each year. This year, the farmer's market money was \$175.00 which we donated to the Shepherd's Table. Also, for the last three years Bedford Christian Church has participated in Operation Christmas Child, a ministry of The Samaritan's Purse. This shoebox ministry provides Christmas gifts to underprivileged children throughout the world. In each of the last two years, BCC members filled seventy to seventy-five boxes. This year the Outreach Committee's goal was eighty boxes. However, by the time all were tallied, BCC members donated enough items to fill 114 boxes. Praise the Lord! A very special thanks is extended to Outreach Chair, Eleanor Coppedge and her team for organizing and packing the boxes.



Disciples Women's Retreat 2023

Guest speaker was Reverend Kelsey Creech, pastor of Virginia Beach Christian Church. Together we read and discussed the book of Ruth during three sessions. Kelsey clarified cultural customs, explained terminology and interpretations of biblical times. Next, Kelsey shared thought-provoking questions that we discussed in small groups of four or five. Then a reporter shared with the large group a summary of discussions. Each session opened with gathering music, the announcements and introduction of the speaker.
